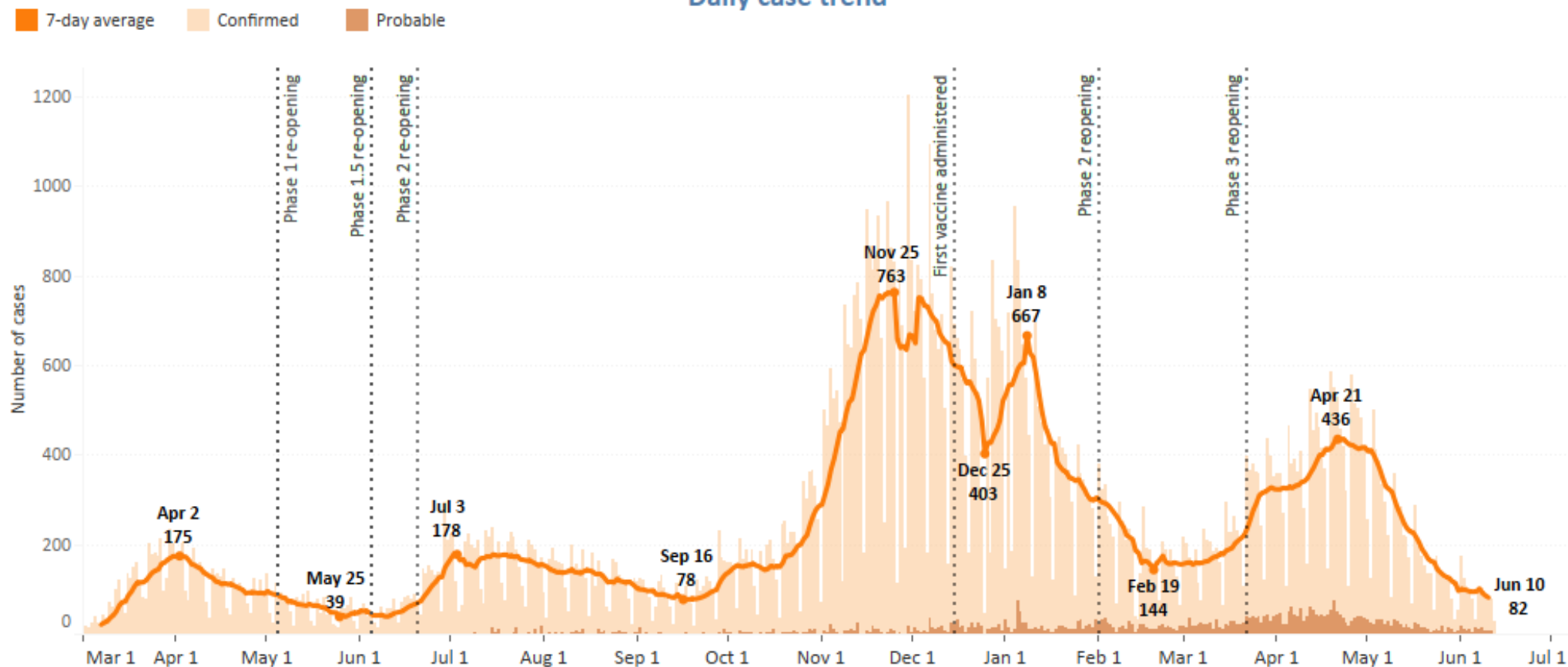


## Case count summary page Monday, June 14, 2021

Over the last week, there has been an **decreasing** trend of case counts (n=575) by **-16.2%** compared to the previous week (n=686)

# VACCINATION



- In Seattle, **71.7%** of all resident 12+ have completed their vaccination series, and **78.7%** have received at least one dose
- Countywide, **68%** of all resident 12+ have completed their vaccination series, and **76.4%** have received at least one dose

# VACCINE ACCESS



- Critical infrastructure workers, including grocery workers, became eligible for vaccination on March 17<sup>th</sup>.
- By April 15<sup>th</sup>, all Washington residents 16 and older became eligible for vaccination.
- Partnered with UFCW Local 21 and Washington Food Industry Association to ensure access across modalities

**No appointment needed at many locations! Age 12 and over now eligible\*!**

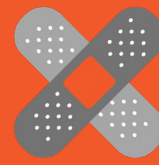
Vaccine is free and available to everyone regardless of insurance, citizenship, or immigration status. Ask your clinic what vaccine types are offered. Drive-through options now available.

\*Those 12 to 17 are only eligible for the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine
